### DAYS 1-3 VIDEO SHOOTING BASICS

Working in small groups of 3-4 participants led by Virginia Tech video facilitators, participants will learn the how to use video cameras, mics, and tripods to create their documentaries in downtown Roanoke.

### DAYS 4-5 EDITING

Using Macbook Pro editing stations and iMovie software, participants will edit their own movies under the guidance of their video facilitator.
